The success of the CCHC and our reputation depend on the ethical conduct and behavior of everyone affiliated with the CCHC. Volunteers and representatives set an example for each other by their pursuit of excellence in high standards of performance, professionalism and ethical conduct.

The volunteer should maintain a high standard of personal conduct in the capacity of a representative of CCHC and should distinguish clearly between statements and actions made as a private individual and as a representative of the CCHC.

The volunteer should strive to become and remain proficient in the performance of their functions at the CCHC

The volunteer should uphold and advance values, ethics, and knowledge of issues relating to youth hockey and should contribute time and professional expertise to activities that promote respect for, integrity towards and competence in serving the CCHC and the hockey community at large.

Volunteers are expected to:

- Follow the rules of USA Hockey and your organization to ensure that its philosophy and objectives are enhanced.
- Support programs that train and educate players, coaches, parents, officials and volunteers.
- Promote and publicize your programs, seek out financial support when possible.
- Communicate with parents by holding parent/player orientation meetings as well as by being available to answer questions and address problems throughout the season.
- Recruit volunteers including coaches who demonstrate qualities conducive to being role models to the youth in our sport.
- Encourage coaches and officials to attend USA Hockey clinics and advise your board members of the necessity for those training sessions.
- Make every possible attempt to provide everyone at all skill levels a place to play.
- Read and be familiar with the contents of the USA Hockey Annual Guide and the USA Hockey official playing rules.
- Develop other administrators to advance to positions in our association, perhaps even your own.
